



E4: Contemporary Issues of Korea Winter Term 2019/20

Addressees	This module is designed for students who have no prior knowledge of Korea or Korean language. Basic understanding of economics and social science may be helpful to understand each session's specific topics, but is not mandatory.	
General Information	The elective module "Contemporary Issues of Korea" consists of two parts which can be found in the LSF as:	
	Introduction to the Korean Economy (Lecture)	Topical Issues of the Korean Economy and Business Management (Seminar)
	The lecture provides an introduction to the economy of Korea and its development, as well as Korea's international (economic) relations with neighboring countries.	The seminar offers a hands-on analysis of selected fields of the Korean economy and business environment, particularly through guest lectures and the review of current literature.
Topics	History of South Korean Economic Development; The Korean Economy between State and Chaebols; Youth Unemployment & Education System; Development of Korea's Financial Policies and the Financial Market; Economy & Innovation; The Economic Effect of Demographic Change & the Aging Society in South Korea; Asian Financial Crisis and the Role of the IMF in South Korea; Regional Economic Relations; FDI, ODA & Trade Linkages in East Asia: The Case of South Korea; Scenarios of a possible Korean Reunification	Topics are related to visiting guest lectures and are expected to include business and economic issues, also on the borderline to political-economic and socio-economic phenomena.
Credit and Grading	The lecture accounts for 3 ECTS points. Course language is English. Your attendance at every session is essential. Participation/homework accounts for 25% of the final grade. A 60-minute written exam at the end of the semester accounts for 75% of the final grade. Students who successfully complete the module earn 6 ECTS points.
